

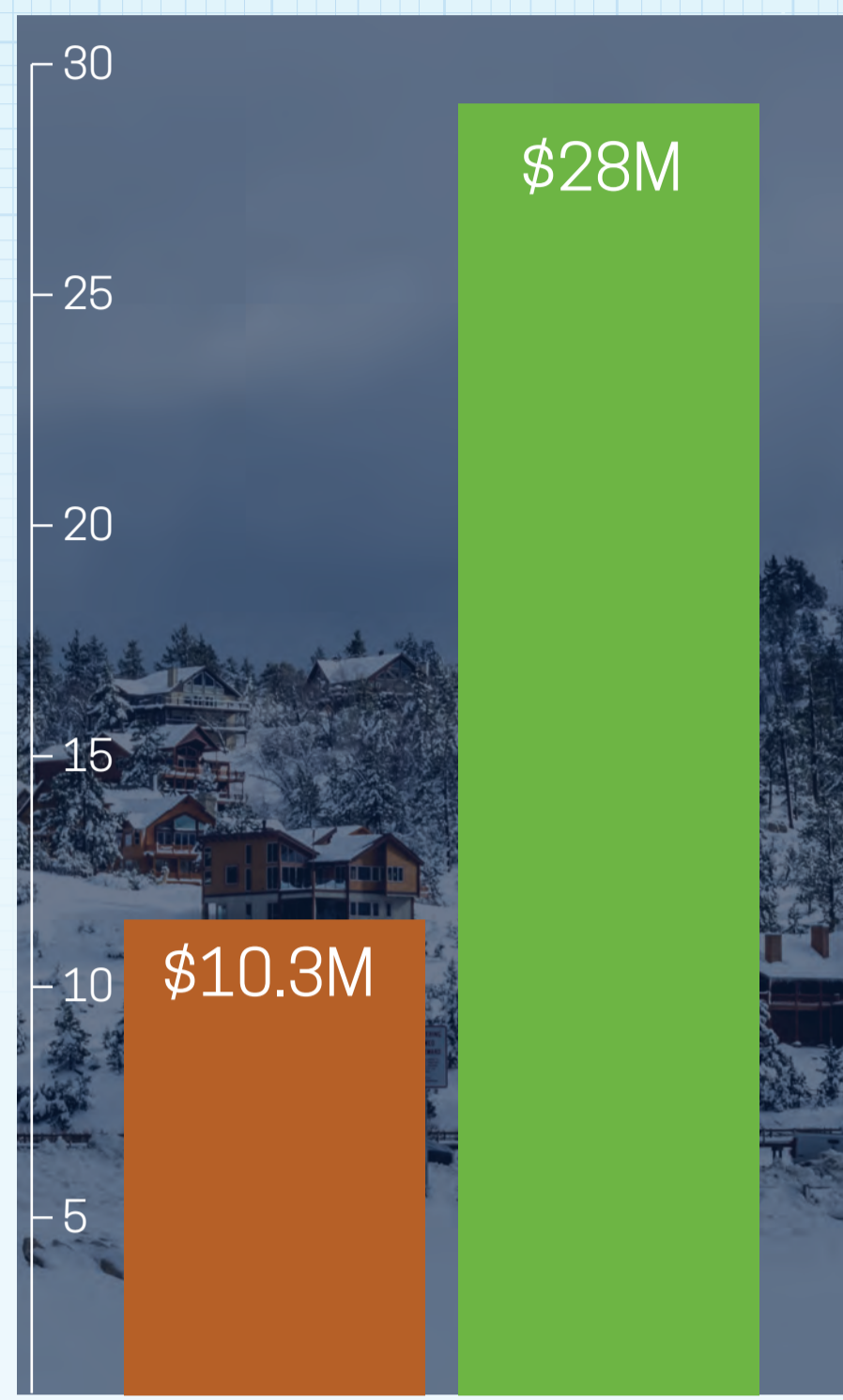

Activists looking to use eminent domain to take over a privately-owned water utility make the condemnation process sound easy. **They couldn't be more wrong.**

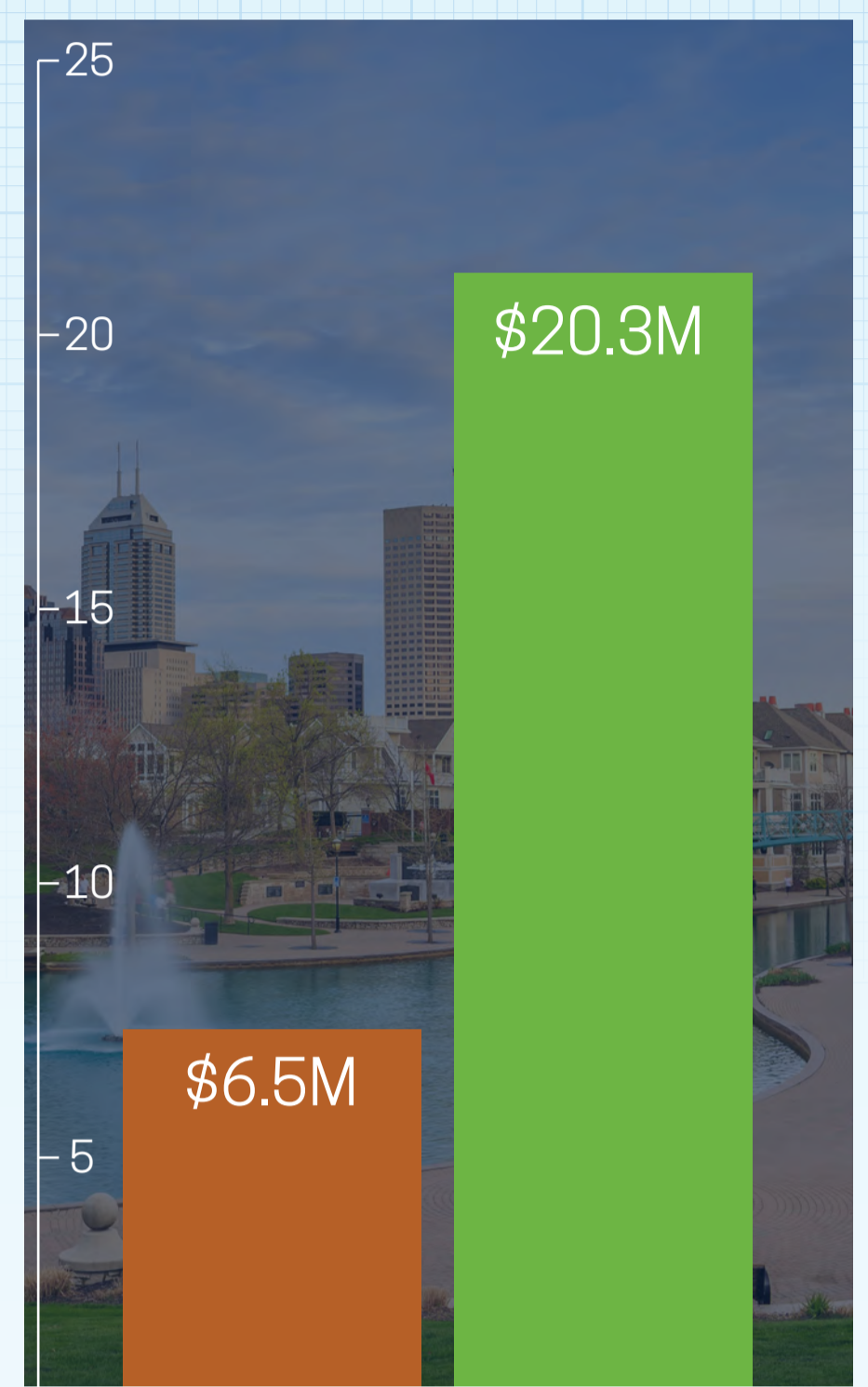
Estimated Aquisition Cost Actual Aquisition Cost



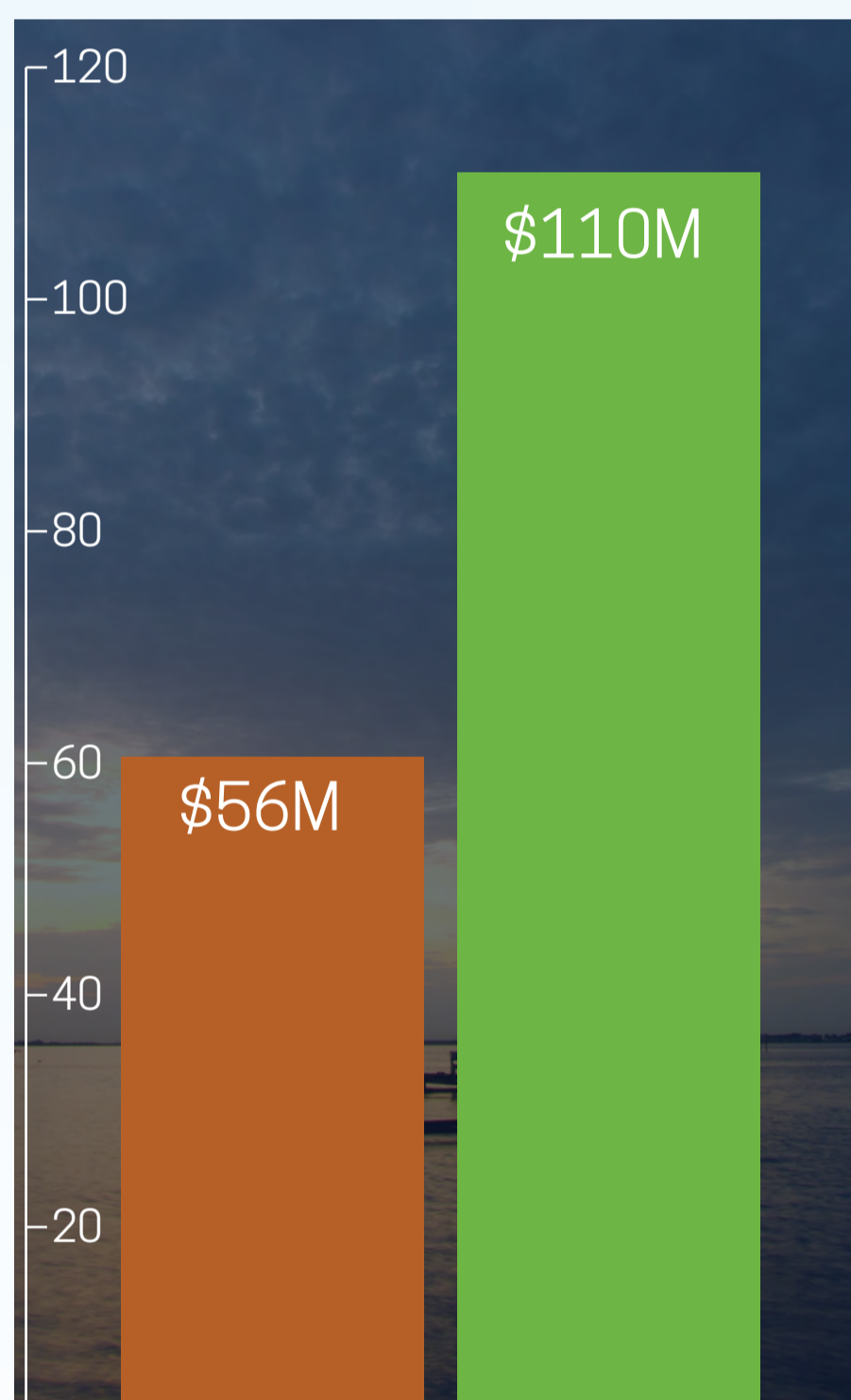

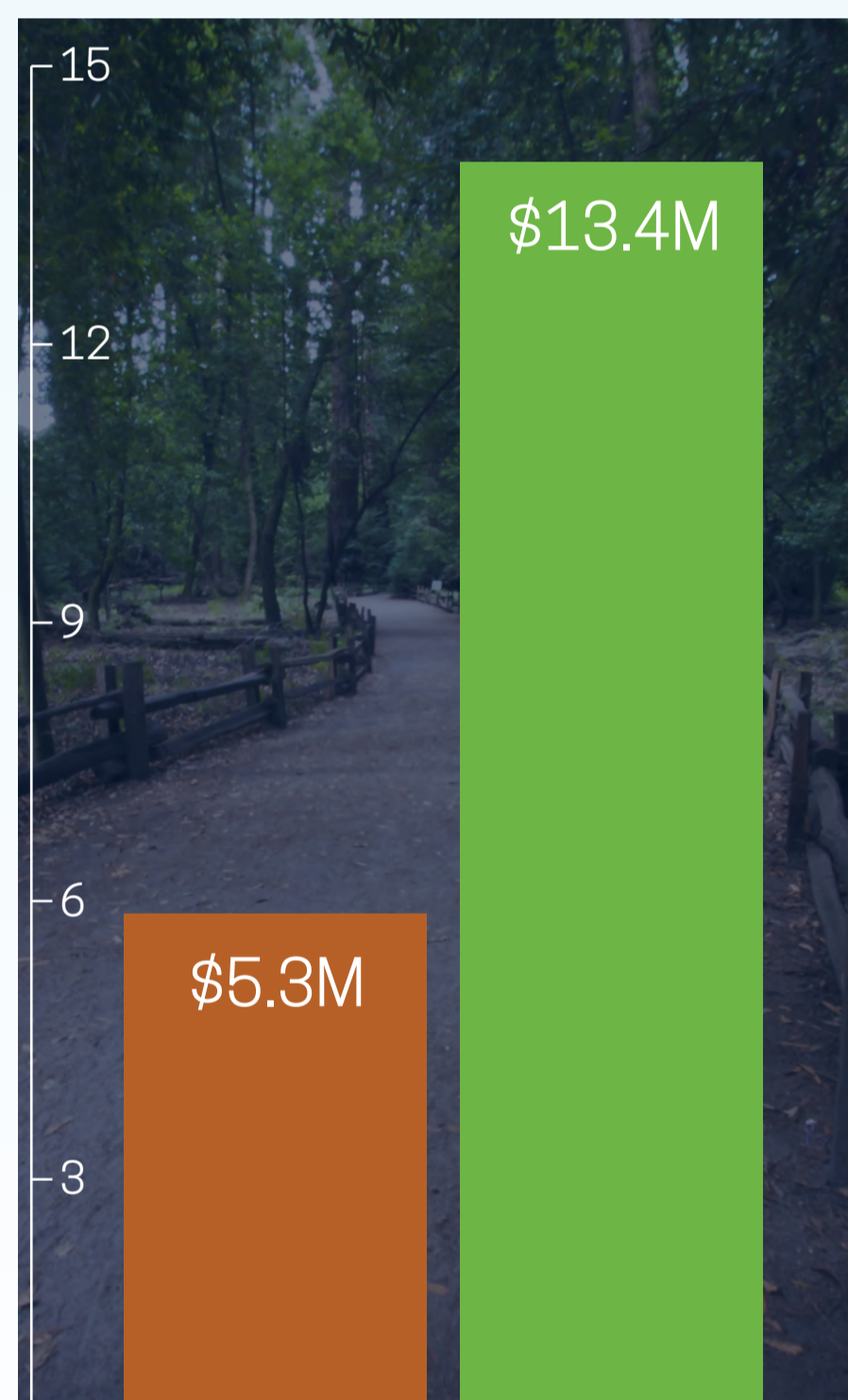

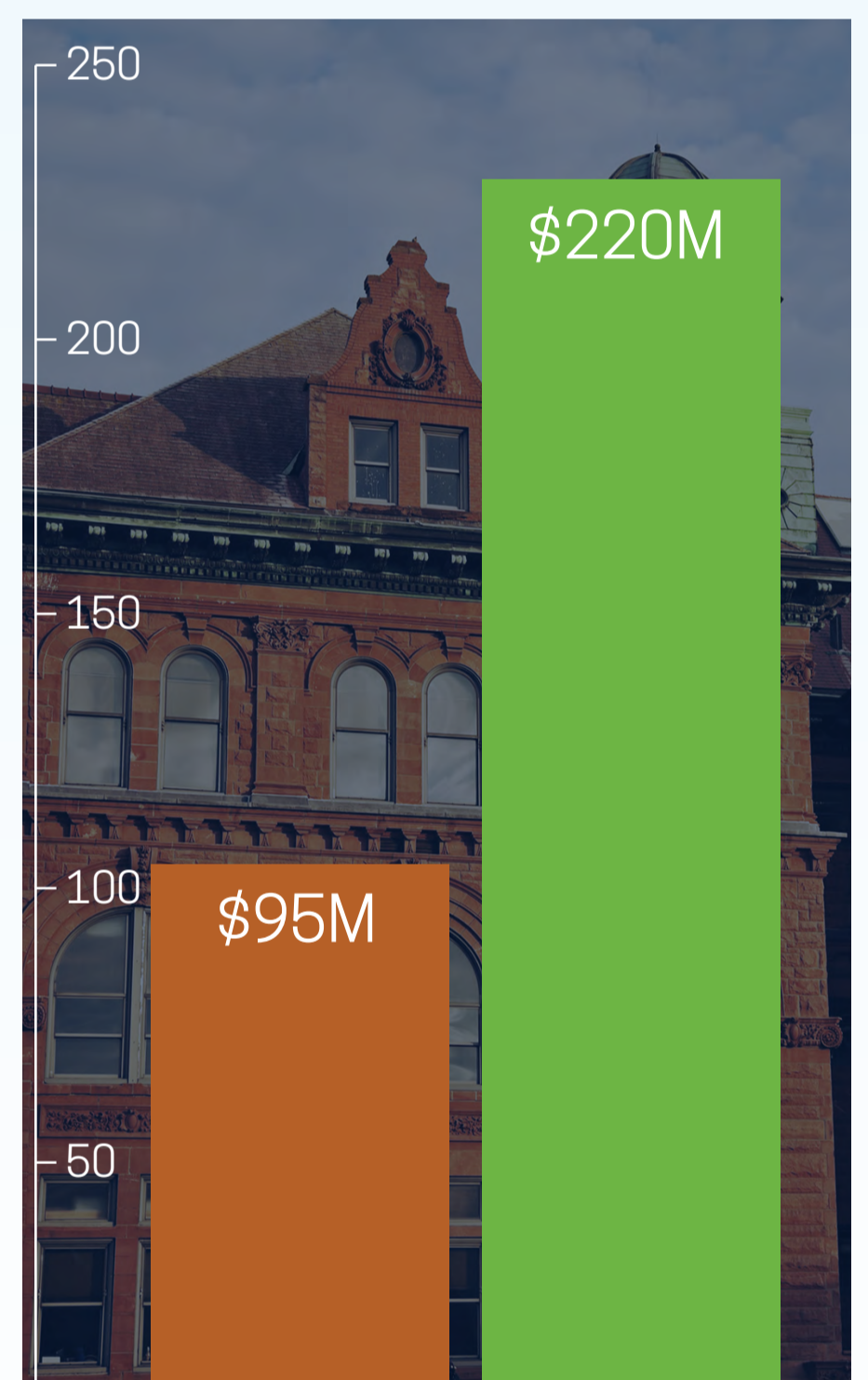
